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1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 PURPOSE OF THIS RFI

The Sandoval County Board of County Commissioners is requesting information on behalf of Sandoval County Community Services for the **Administration and Management of a Pilot Fertility Control Program for the Free Roaming Horses of the Placitas Area**. The responses will be accepted in the Finance Department, Attn: Ms. Trish Greene, Sandoval County Administrative Bldg., 1500 Idalia Road, Bldg. D, 2nd Floor, and P.O. Box 40, Bernalillo, New Mexico until 3pm (Mountain Standard Time) on December 18, 2018. The Sandoval County Board of Commissioners reserves the right to reject any and all responses.

Sandoval County ("County"), members of the Placitas community, and other stakeholders continue to grapple with humane, legal, sustainable solutions for the area's free roaming horses.

In 2014, The County commissioned a Task Force conducted by New Mexico First designed to share information and suggest solutions for the humane treatment of the horses, sustainability of the environment, and potential actions for residents, neighborhoods, and government agencies. Efforts to implement the resulting recommendations have been challenging and fractured for a whole host of reasons, and since then herd sizes have only continued to grow.

One of the recommendations from the New Mexico First Report included the administration of a fertility control program, which is something the County has been exploring with the Bureau of Land Management ("BLM") and the New Mexico Livestock Board ("NMLB").

As an initial step in the procurement process, this Request for Information ("RFI") has been prepared to assist the County in fully understanding the number of prospective eligible vendors currently available.

This is a request for information ONLY and not a solicitation.

1.2 HOW TO SUBMIT A RESPONSE

1.3 FURTHER ACTIONS

The County will review the response(s) to this RFI, which may subsequently lead to requests for further clarification and further investigation.

Information received in response to this RFI may be used in the preparation of a Professional Services Agreement consistent with County Policy and in full compliance with the Procurement Code.

Failure to respond to this RFI **DOES NOT** disqualify any firm or organization from being considered for future Request for Proposals (RFP) solicitations.

2 SCOPE

The County desires a fertility control and management vendor that knows the complexity behind the issue of the free roaming horses in the Placitas area, is or is willing to become properly certified and insured to administer such a program, possess the capacity to appropriately manage such a program, is an established and sustainable organization, is (preferably) a local organization, and has cooperative relations with members of the community, the County, the BLM, and the NMLB. Eligible vendors must be in good standing with the Internal Revenue Service, the New Mexico Attorney General's Office, and the New Mexico Secretary of State. They must also meet all required County insurance provisions.

The work of the vendor would be overseen by a multidisciplinary Advisory Council consisting of members from the community, The County, and related government entities.
