### Valuation Freeze

Minimize Your Property Tax Increases

#### What is a Valuation Freeze?

By applying and qualifying for this benefit, you can prevent your property valuation from increasing each year on your place of residence. Preventing your valuation from increasing will assist you in minimizing your future property tax increases.

#### Who is Eligible?

- Persons who are 65 years or older and had a gross household income of \$35,000 or less in the year prior to making application.
- Persons who are disabled (at any age) and had a gross household income of \$35,000 or less in the year prior to making application.

#### Deadline to Apply

To qualify, you must submit the required application to the office of the Assessor no later than 30 days after the mailing of the Assessor's official "Notice of Value". The "Notice" is typically mailed out on or around April 1<sup>st</sup> of each year. Applications are available in our office and on our website.

#### Proof of Income

You must provide proof of your modified gross income from the previous year along with your application. Proof of income can include: federal income tax or state income



#### Informing You

In 2013 our office along with Senator Shendo simplified the valuation freeze legislation which took effect as of the 2014 tax year.

##### *7-36-21.3 NMSA Paragraph E*

*....An owner who applies for the limitation of value specified in this section and files proof of income eligibility for the three consecutive years immediately prior to the tax year for which the application is made need not claim the limitation for subsequent tax years if there is no change in eligibility. The County Assessor shall apply that limitation automatically in subsequent tax years until a change in eligibility occurs*

Upon approval of the application the owner will receive a letter from the office. An owner who has claimed and been allowed the "freeze" for three consecutive tax years need not apply for subsequent tax years as long as there is no change in eligibility. If the owner is denied, a letter will be sent out explaining the reasoning for the denial.

Owners must report any change in eligibility to the County Assessor.
