TRIBAL COVID-19 FUNDING

RESPONSE & RECOVERY THROUGH FEDERAL, STATE, LOCAL, TRIBAL PARTNERSHIPS

- Most issues and incidents begin and end locally and are executed at the local or tribal level. Local, State, tribal, territorial, and insular area governments better understand the needs of their citizens and have direct relationships.
- These incidents often require unified response from local agencies, the private sector, tribes, and non-governmental organizations (NGOs).

Noncompetitive Grant: Supporting Tribal Public Health Capacity in Coronavirus Preparedness and Response (CDC-RFA-OT20-2004)

- This emergency funding is designed to fund federally recognized tribes that contract or compact with the Indian Health Service under Title I and Title V of the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act, or consortia of these tribes, or their bona fide agents.
- During a national emergency, these organizations are uniquely positioned to provide emergency preparedness and response support for tribal health departments and other components of the tribal public health system.

COVID-19 Response Supplement: Strengthening Public Health Systems and Services through National Partnerships to Improve and Protect the Nation's Health (CDC-RFA-OT18-120)

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic: Public Assistance Simplified Application

FEMA funding to eligible applicants for costs related to emergency protective measures conducted as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Local, tribal and territorial governments, or eligible private nonprofits

1. Log on and create account at Public Assistance (PA) Grants Portal
2. Submit a Request for Public Assistance (RPA)
3. Submit a COVID-19 Streamlined Project Application
4. FEMA and Recipient review documents
5. Applicant Signs Project
6. Receive funding through Recipient

FY 2020 Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding Program

The Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding (CESF) Program will provide funding to assist eligible states, local units of government, and tribes in preventing, preparing for, and responding to the coronavirus. Allowable projects and purchases include, but are not limited to, overtime, equipment (including law enforcement and medical personal protective equipment), hiring, supplies (such as gloves, masks, sanitizer), training, travel expenses, and addressing the medical needs of inmates in state, local, and tribal prisons, jails, and detention centers.
