Overwhelming input and support from Sandoval county residents is urging you to send the Stoddard ordinance back to the Planning & Zoning Committee. This ordinance provides NO protections to county residents and is a blank check for the oil and gas industry to drill on county land with little oversight.

The cancer-causing 'proprietary' chemical 'goo' that is power-injected by fracking, runs into and around in the underground water supply - which negatively affects every person in Sandoval, including all people distant from the drilling sights.

The amendments separate the county's residents, where some more affluent areas enjoy protections yet rural, poorer areas have none.
