 - a. New Visitor Guide Development
 - i. Goal is to have new visitor guide over the course of the next 12 months.
 - b. Visitor Center Updates
 - i. Beginning to see an increase of tourism related calls to the Visitor Center. There have been times over the past year we have not received a tourism call for a month at a time. We are currently seeing 2-5 calls a week.
 - ii. Visitor Center is now moved to Salazar Building, waiting to open to the public for some safety issues are taken care of.
 - iii. Working on strategy to get area open to the public, currently ordering a camera and chime system. Just need a door locking mechanism.
 - iv. Signage on property allows instant access to Visitor Center by calling the number on the door.
 - v. Not seen any increase in in-person Visitor Center traffic.

 - X. Kashe-Katuwe Tent Rocks National Monument
 - i. March 29, 2022 update: Kasha-Katuwe Tent Rocks National Monument is currently closed to the public. During the closure, BLM has had the opportunity to work on projects to enhance the visitor experience upon reopening. Projects include upgrade to trails to alleviate safety concerns within the monument. In addition, the monument has published its first Draft Business Plan outlining the current state of the Kasha-Katuwe Tent Rocks National Monument Recreation Program to ensure consistency with required statutes and laws, and establishes future management goals and priorities of the program. While the initial closure was an attempt to reduce COVID-19 exposure to the gateway community of Pueblo de Cochiti, BLM has decided to maintain the closure status of the Monument until a reopening plan has been finalized. BLM is continuing to

work in close cooperation with the Pueblo de Cochiti to develop a reopening plan to address long standing issues including over-visitation, long wait times, staffing needs, and ability to provide resource protection.

It is BLM's hope that through these efforts, the Monument will re-open in a way that reduces impacts on the land and resources, as well as to the Cochiti people, and will provide an improved experience for all visitors. As reopening plans become more solidified, BLM will be releasing new information to the public via https://www.blm.gov/visit/kktr and our social media pages. We look forward to seeing our visitors when we reopen!

Pageviews: how many pages on our website we viewed out of the total amount of users. Pages/session: an average of how many pages were viewed per visitor. Time on site: on average, how long a visitor was on the website. Bounce rate: the percentage of users who clicked through to our website and immediately left. Social Media leads: how many visitors to the website came from one of our social media platforms.
