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I worked for Sandoval Regional Medical Center for just shy of 8 years until August 23, 22 when I was terminated after I had a miscarriage on Aug 18, 22. One day I was told that I could not return to work until cleared by a doctor and the next day I was terminated after "no call no show" I had been assisting my colleagues in their right to form a union. However after filing a prohibited practice complaint against the manager of 3 inpatient units for intimidating employees to stop this process. I like to point out that for a year SRMC has been paying for their high profile lawyer to fight the employees who want this. I wonder why they are in a deficit. Since I was terminated I continue to fight with my former colleagues and work family as the many years I have been working trying to get terrible things fixed. For over 4 years I asked for wheel chairs that worked and have breaks that work, for thermometers that way we don't have to supply ourselves, needing pens, highlighters, they don't supply their employees. It was terrible Watching good nurses leave after they were used to work overtime and sit next to dying patients during the pandemic. We never management put on scrub to help. Being ignored time and time again about significant safety concerns had been ignored and patients hurt. The work environment is plagued with fear, intimidation so bad that no one wants to say anything or bring up the concerns that need to be brought up. For the last 2 and a half months the very expensive lawyer has been fighting for a prohibited practice complaint union lawyers file against SRMC on my behalf for my wrongful termination and I have been subjected to requests to relive this terrible medical condition I found myself in being sent questioning me by saying "alleged miscarriage" even though they have all medical records pertaining to the situation. This is mentally draining and causing tramadol and anguish over and over, and they say they are trying to help behavioral health concerns and causing these in the employees who have been working so hard for the patients we care for.
