I. INTRODUCTION

A. PURPOSE OF THIS REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

The Sandoval County Board of County Commissioners is accepting sealed bids on behalf of the Sandoval County Community Services Department from qualified bidders to establish multi-year pricing agreement(s) for Veterinary Services (NIGP Commodity Codes: 96186). Responses will be accepted in the Finance Department, Attn: Leslie Olivas, Sandoval County Administrative Offices, 1500 Idalia Road, Bldg. D, 2nd Floor, Bernalillo, New Mexico 87004 until 3:00 p.m. (Mountain Standard Time) on December 30, 2025. Late submissions will not be considered. The Sandoval Board of County Commissioners reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

B. SCOPE OF BID

The Sandoval County (“County”) Purchasing Office is accepting sealed bids from experienced and qualified bidders to provide Veterinary Services. The successful offeror(s) will work collaboratively with the Animal Services Team to assure all animals receive care and treatment promptly. The Price Agreement(s) will be for a one (1) year base period of performance with three (3) one-year optional renewals. The maximum length of the price agreement(s) shall not exceed four (4) years. This solicitation will result in a multi-award.

C. PROCUREMENT MANAGER

B. EXPLANATION OF EVENTS

The following paragraphs describe the activities listed in the sequence of events shown in Section II. A., above.

1. Issuance of RFP

This ITB is being issued on behalf of the Community Services Department – Animal Care Services.

2. Acknowledgement of Receipt

Potential Bidders may e-mail, hand deliver, return by facsimile or registered or certified mail the “Acknowledgment of Receipt of Request for Proposals Form” that accompanies this document, APPENDIX A, to have the bidder placed on the procurement distribution list. The form should be signed by an authorized representative of the offeror, dated, and returned to the Procurement Manager by the date referenced in the Sequence of Events.

The procurement distribution list will be used for the distribution of written responses to questions.

3. Mandatory Pre-Bid Conference and Site Visit

This section is not applicable for this procurement.

4. Deadline to Submit Written Questions

Potential Bidders may submit written questions to the Procurement Manager as to the intent or clarity of this ITB as indicated in the sequence of events. All written questions must be addressed to the Procurement Manager as declared in Section I, Paragraph C. Questions shall be clearly labeled and shall cite the section(s) in the ITB or other document which forms the basis of the question.

5. Response to Written Questions

Responses to written questions will be distributed as indicated in the sequence of events to all potential Bidders whose name appears on the procurement distribution list. An e-mail copy will be sent all Bidders that provide an Acknowledgement of Receipt Form.

6. Submission of Bids

ALL BIDS MUST BE RECEIVED FOR REVIEW AND EVALUATION BY THE PROCUREMENT MANAGER OR DESIGNEE NO LATER THAN 3:00 PM MOUNTAIN STANDARD TIME (MST) ON December 30, 2025. Bids received after this deadline will not be accepted. The date and time of receipt will be recorded on each proposal.

Bids must be addressed and delivered to the Procurement Manager at the address listed in Section I, Paragraph C2. Proposals must be sealed and labeled on the outside of the package to clearly indicate that they are in response to the **Veterinary Services ITB #FY26-SCCS-01**. Bids submitted by facsimile or other electronic means will not be accepted.

A public log will be kept of the names of all Offerors that submitted proposals. Pursuant to NMSA 1978, § 13-1-116, the contents of proposals shall not be disclosed to competing potential Offerors during the negotiation process. The negotiation process is deemed to be in effect until the contract is awarded pursuant to this Request for Proposals.

7. Bid Tabulation

Any contractual agreement(s) resulting from this ITB will be finalized with the most advantageous Bidder(s) as per schedule Section II.A., Sequence of Events, or as soon thereafter as possible. This date is subject to change at the discretion of Sandoval County.

8. Commission Approval

The contract(s) shall be awarded to the Bidder(s) whose Bid(s) is most advantageous to Sandoval County and the Sandoval County Community Services Department. The award is subject to appropriate Sandoval County Commission approval.

9. Bid Award

After review of the bids, the contract(s) for the item(s) or services will be awarded to the lowest Responsible and Responsive Bidder(s) meeting or exceeding the required specification for this sealed bid.

10. Protest Deadline

Any protest by an Offeror must be timely and in conformance with NMSA 1978, § 13-1-172 and applicable procurement regulations. As a Protest Manager has been named in this Request for Bids, pursuant to NMSA 1978, § 13-1-172, **ONLY** protests delivered directly to the Protest Manager in writing and in a timely fashion will be considered to have been submitted properly and in accordance with statute, rule and this Request for Bids. The 15-calendar day protest period shall begin on the day following the award of contracts and will end at 5:00 pm Mountain Standard Time/Daylight Time on the 15th day. Protests must be written and must include the name and address of the protestor and the request for proposal number. It must also contain a statement of the grounds for protest including appropriate supporting exhibits and it must specify the ruling requested from the party listed below. Protests received after the deadline will not be accepted.

C. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1. Acceptance of Conditions Governing the Procurement

Potential Offerors must indicate their acceptance of the Conditions Governing the Procurement section in the letter of transmittal (Appendix C). Submission of a proposal constitutes acceptance of the Evaluation Factors.

2. Incurring Cost

Any cost incurred by the potential Offeror in preparation, transmittal, and/or presentation of any proposal or material submitted in response to this RFP shall be borne solely by the Offeror. Any cost incurred by the Offeror for set up and demonstration of the proposed equipment and/or system shall be borne solely by the Offeror.

3. Prime Contractor Responsibility

Any contractual agreement that may result from this RFP shall specify that the prime contractor is solely responsible for fulfillment of all requirements of the contractual agreement which may derive from this RFP.

4. Amended Bids

A Bidder may submit an amended bid before the deadline for receipt of bids. Such amended bids must be complete replacements for a previously submitted bid and must be clearly identified as such in the transmittal letter. The County personnel will not merge, collate, or assemble proposal materials.

5. Bidder's Rights to Withdraw Proposal

Bidders will be allowed to withdraw their bids at any time prior to the deadline for receipt of bids. The Bidder must submit a written withdrawal request addressed to the Procurement Manager and be signed by the Bidder's duly authorized representative.

The approval or denial of withdrawal requests received after the deadline for receipt of the proposals is governed by the applicable procurement regulations.

6. Proposal Offer Firm

Responses to this ITB, including proposal prices for services, will be considered firm for one hundred twenty (120) days after the due date for receipt of proposals or ninety (90) days after the due date for the receipt of a best and final offer, if the Bidder is invited or required to submit one.

7. No Obligation

This ITB in no manner obligates Sandoval County to the use of any Bidder's services until a valid written contract is awarded and approved by appropriate authorities.

8. Termination

This ITB may be canceled at any time and any and all bids may be rejected in whole or in part when the agency determines such action to be in the best interest of Sandoval County.

9. Sufficient Appropriation

Any contract awarded as a result of this ITB process may be terminated if sufficient appropriations or authorizations do not exist. Such terminations will be affected by sending written notice to the contractor. The County's decision as to whether sufficient appropriations and authorizations are available will be accepted by the contractor as final.

10. Legal Review

The County requires that all Bidders agree to be bound by the General Requirements contained in this ITB. Any Offeror's concerns must be promptly submitted in writing to the attention of the Procurement Manager.

11. Governing Law

This ITB and any agreement with an Bidder which may result from this procurement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Mexico, and the ordinances of Sandoval County.

12. Basis for Bid

Only information supplied, in writing, by Sandoval County through the Procurement Manager or in this ITB should be used as the basis for the preparation of Bids.

13. Bidder Qualifications

The Bid Tabulation Committee may make such investigations as necessary to determine the ability of the potential Bidder to adhere to the requirements specified within this ITB. The Bid Tabulation Committee will reject the bid of any potential Bidder who is not a Responsible Bidder or fails to submit a responsive bid as defined in NMSA 1978, § 13-1-83 and 13-1-85.

Bidders must, upon request of the County, provide information and data to prove that the financial resources, production or service facilities, service reputation and experience are adequate to make satisfactory delivery of materials and/or service.

14. Right to Waive Minor Irregularities

The Bid Tabulation Committee reserves the right to waive minor irregularities. The Bid Tabulation Committee also reserves the right to waive mandatory requirements provided that all of the otherwise responsive bids failed to meet the same mandatory requirements and the failure to do so does not otherwise materially affect the procurement. This right is at the sole discretion of the Bid Tabulation Committee.

15. Notice of Penalties

The Procurement Code, NMSA 1978, § 13-1-28 through 13-1-199, imposes civil, misdemeanor and felony criminal penalties for its violation. In addition, the New Mexico criminal statutes impose felony penalties for bribes, gratuities and kickbacks.

16. Right to Publish

Throughout the duration of this procurement process and contract term, Bidders and contractors must secure from the County written approval prior to the release of any information that pertains to the potential work or activities covered by this procurement and/or County contracts deriving from this procurement. Failure to adhere to this requirement may result in disqualification of the Bidder's bid or removal from the contract.

17. Ownership of Proposals

All documents submitted in response to this ITB shall become property of Sandoval County.

18. Confidentiality

Any confidential information provided to, or developed by, the contractor in the performance of the contract resulting from this ITB shall be kept confidential and shall not be made available to any individual or organization by the contractor without the prior written approval of the County.

The Contractor(s) agrees to protect the confidentiality of all confidential information and not to publish or disclose such information to any third party without the procuring County's written permission.

19. Use of Electronic Versions of this ITB

This ITB is being made available by electronic means. In the event of conflict between a version of the ITB in the Bidder's possession and the version maintained by the agency, the Bidder acknowledges that the version maintained by the County shall govern.

20. Campaign Contribution Disclosure Form

Bidder must complete, sign, and return the Campaign Contribution Disclosure Form as a part of their bid. Failure to complete and return the signed unaltered form will result in disqualification.

21. Letter of Transmittal

The Bidder's bid must be accompanied by the Letter of Transmittal Form which must be completed and signed by any individual person authorized to obligate the company. The letter of transmittal MUST:

- A. Identify the submitting business entity.
- B. Identify the name, title, telephone number, and e-mail address of the person authorized by the Offeror organization to contractually obligate the business entity providing the Offer.
- C. Identify the name, title, telephone number, and e-mail address of the person authorized to negotiate the contract on behalf of the organization (if different than (b) above.).
- D. Identify the names, titles, telephone numbers, and e-mail addresses of persons to be contacted for clarifications/questions regarding proposal content.
- E. Acknowledge that a sub-contractor will not be authorized for this procurement.
- F. Identify the following with a check mark and signature where required:
 - 1. Indicate acceptance of the Conditions Governing the Procurement, indicated acceptance of this RFP; and
 - 2. Acknowledge receipt of any and all amendments to this RFP.
- G. Be signed by the person identified in (b) above.

22. New Mexico Preferences

To ensure adequate consideration and application of NMSA 1978, § 13-1-21 (as amended), Offerors **MUST** include a copy of their preference certificate with their proposal. Certificates for preferences must be obtained through the New Mexico Department of Taxation and Revenue: <https://www.tax.newmexico.gov/businesses/business-preference-certification/>

A. New Mexico Resident Business Preference

A copy of the certification must accompany the Offeror's proposal.

B. New Mexico Native American Resident Business Preference

A copy of the certification must accompany the Offeror's proposal.

C. New Mexico Resident Veterans Business Preference

A copy of the certification must accompany the Offeror's proposal.

D. New Mexico Native American Resident Veterans Business Preference

A copy of the certification must accompany the Offeror's proposal.

An agency shall not award a business for more than one preference.

The New Mexico Preferences shall not apply when the expenditures for this RFP include federal funds.

23. Americans with Disabilities Act

Sandoval County is committed to ensuring that all its programs, services, activities, and digital resources are accessible to individuals with disabilities, in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), Rehabilitation Act, and all other applicable state and local accessibility laws and regulations.

III. RESPONSE FORMAT AND ORGANIZATION

This section describes the format and organization of the Bidder's responses. Failure to conform to these guidelines may result in the disqualification of the bid.

A. NUMBER OF RESPONSES

Offerors shall submit only one bid in response to this ITB.

B. NUMBER OF COPIES

Bidders shall deliver (1) original, one (1) copy, and one (1) electronic PDF copy in the submission of signed and sealed bids to the location specified in Section 1 Paragraph C on or before the closing date and time for the receipt of bids.

C. BID CONTENTS

All Bids **MUST** contain the following items:

- 1. COMPLETED, SIGNED AND TO BE E-MAILED/FAXED** Acknowledgement of Receipt Form (Appendix A)

2. **COMPLETED AND SIGNED** Campaign Contribution Disclosure Form (Appendix B)
3. **COMPLETED AND SIGNED** Letter of Transmittal Form (Appendix C)
4. **COMPLETED AND SIGNED** Conflict of Interest Affidavit (Appendix D)
5. **COMPLETED AND SIGNED** Non-Collusion Affidavit (Appendix E)
6. **COMPLETED AND SIGNED** Bid Form (Appendix F)

D. BID FORMAT

All Bids must be submitted as follows:

1. Typewritten on standard 8 ½ x 11 inch paper (larger paper is permissible for charts, spreadsheets, etc.) and placed within binders with tabs delineating each section.
2. Quotes: The quote is to include all items covered in the Scope of Work
3. Delivery Time: Delivery Time stated in the specifications shall apply.
4. Payment Terms: Bidder must identify the Payment terms offered in Bid Documents.

IV. SPECIFICATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

Sandoval County is seeking to contract with a veterinary services provider or providers for services to the Sandoval County Animal Resource Center. Awarded contractors must have qualified personnel available to examine animals brought in by the Sandoval County Animal Resource Center and Animal Control. Veterinary consultation will be during business hours, and after-hours and emergency basis, where available.

The successful offerors will provide the requested services, where available, or list specifically what services they do or do not provide, to include, but not limited to the following: The veterinarian shall provide as needed sterilizations of dogs and cats; the County will contact the veterinarian for a sterilization appointment and shall deliver the animal to the veterinarian's private practice office; or the animal will be delivered to the office and picked up at agreed on time frame. The veterinarian may provide any additional vaccinations and/or other procedures as recommended to and/or requested by the County, at rates determined by the veterinarian and billed to the County.

Sterilization services shall include, at minimum, the following:

- a. Evaluating animals, when appropriate, to determine their suitability for the operation;
- b. Performing the operation in a timely manner;
- c. Communication if unable to perform the operation; and
- d. Follow-up care in the event of complications.

The veterinarian shall provide as needed euthanasia and vaccination services, such as rabies.

MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS

The following shall be included with the completed bid document:

- Provide a current copy of appropriate licenses issued by the State of New Mexico Pharmaceutical Board. The successful bidder(s) shall maintain current licensure throughout the duration of the resulting contract.
- Provide a current copy of appropriate licenses issued by the State of New Mexico Board of Veterinary Medicine. The successful bidder(s) shall maintain current licensure throughout the duration of the resulting contract.
- Provide a list of Miscellaneous Supplies excluding those listed on the Bid Form (Appendix F) that may incur a charge to the County. These supplies may include, but are not limited to: syringes, needles, vaccines, antibiotics, and euthanasia medicines.

V. EVALUATION PROCESS

1. Compliance Review

After the required public opening and reading, all timely Bids will be reviewed for compliance with the requirements and specifications stated within the ITB. Bids deemed non-responsive will be eliminated from further consideration.

2. Clarifications

The Procurement Manager may contact the Bidder for clarification of a response.

3. Other Information Sources

The County may use other sources of information to confirm the validity of the bids submitted and the ability of the Bidder to perform.

4. Bid Tabulation

The bid price(s) on the Bid Form from the timely and responsive bids will be tabulated (price compared) to identify the lowest priced bid. If applicable, the price bids will be adjusted (for comparison and award purposes only) for those Bidders that submitted a valid Preference Certificate with their bid.

5. Discrepancies in Price(s)

In the case of an error in the Extended Price and Unit Price, the Unit Price shall govern.

6. Determination of Lowest Price

After completion of the bid tabulation, the County will examine the results to determine which Bidder offered the lowest price to the County in accordance with the specifications, terms, and conditions set forth in this Invitation to Bid.

VI. APPENDICES

1. Acknowledgement of Receipt Form

Potential Bidders **should** hand deliver or return by facsimile, registered or certified mail, or email the “Acknowledgment of Receipt Form” (see APPENDIX A) that accompanies this document to have their organization placed on the procurement distribution list. The form **should** be signed by an authorized representative of the organization and delivered to the Procurement Manager no later than the date specified in the Sequence of Events. The procurement distribution list will be used for the distribution of important information regarding this procurement.

2. Campaign Contribution Disclosure Form

The Bidder must complete an unaltered Campaign Contribution Disclosure Form and submit a signed copy with the Bidder’s proposal. This must be accomplished whether or not an applicable contribution has been made. (See APPENDIX B).

3. Letter of Transmittal Form

The Bidder’s bid **must** be accompanied by the Letter of Transmittal Form (See APPENDIX C). This form **must** be completed and must be signed by the person authorized to obligate the company.

4. Conflict of Interest Affidavit

Bidders must include signed and completed Conflict of Interest Form (See APPENDIX D) with ITM documents. The Bidder warrants that it presently has no interest and shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance or services required under the Agreement. The Bidder certifies that the requirements of the Governmental Conduct Code Act, Sections 10-16-1 through 10-16-18, NMSA 1978, regarding contracting with a public officer or state employee or former state employee have been followed.

5. Non-Collusion Affidavit

In signing this form (See APPENDIX E), the Bidder certifies he/she has not, either directly or indirectly, entered into action in restraint of free competitive bidding in connection with this offer submitted to the County.

6. Bid Form

This form (See APPENDIX F) is to present the cost to the Count and to include all items required for this Bid. **Bid Form may be modified to accommodate additional items not included on original form but must remain in the original format.**

APPENDIX B
CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTION DISCLOSURE FORM

Campaign Contribution Disclosure Form

Pursuant to NMSA 1978, § 13-1-191.1 (2006), any person seeking to enter into a contract with any state agency or local public body for professional services, a design and build project delivery system, or the design and installation of measures the primary purpose of which is to conserve natural resources must file this form with that state agency or local public body. This form must be filed even if the contract qualifies as a small purchase or a sole source contract. The prospective contractor must disclose whether they, a family member or a representative of the prospective contractor has made a campaign contribution to an applicable public official of the state or a local public body during the two years prior to the date on which the contractor submits a proposal or, in the case of a sole source or small purchase contract, the two years prior to the date the contractor signs the contract, if the aggregate total of contributions given by the prospective contractor, a family member or a representative of the prospective contractor to the public official exceeds two-hundred-fifty dollars (\$250) over the two year period.

Furthermore, the state agency or local public body shall void an executed contract or cancel a solicitation or proposed award for a proposed contract if: 1) a prospective contractor, a family member of the prospective contractor, or a representative of the prospective contractor gives a campaign contribution or other thing of value to an applicable public official or the applicable public official's employees during the pendency of the procurement process or 2) a prospective contractor fails to submit a fully completed disclosure statement pursuant to the law.

THIS FORM MUST BE FILED BY ANY PROSPECTIVE CONTRACTOR WHETHER OR NOT THEY, THEIR FAMILY MEMBER, OR THEIR REPRESENTATIVE HAS MADE ANY CONTRIBUTIONS SUBJECT TO DISCLOSURE.

The following definitions apply:

“Applicable public official” means a person elected to an office or a person appointed to complete a term of an elected office, who has the authority to award or influence the award of the contract for which the prospective contractor is submitting a competitive sealed proposal or who has the authority to negotiate a sole source or small purchase contract that may be awarded without submission of a sealed competitive proposal.

“Campaign Contribution” means a gift, subscription, loan, advance or deposit of money or other thing of value, including the estimated value of an in-kind contribution, that is made to or received by an applicable public official or any person authorized to raise, collect or expend contributions on that official's behalf for the purpose of electing the official to either statewide or local office. “Campaign Contribution” includes the payment of a debt incurred in an election campaign, but does not include the value of services provided without compensation or unreimbursed travel or other personal expenses of individuals who volunteer a portion or all of their time on behalf of a candidate or political committee, nor does it include the administrative or solicitation expenses of a political committee that are paid by an organization that sponsors the committee.
