QUARTERLY REPORT FOR THE PERIOD April 1, 2024 – June 30, 2024

The Sandoval County Ethics Board ("Ethics Board") submits this report pursuant to Section 8(j)(3) of the Sandoval County Ethics Ordinance which states, in pertinent part:

...The ethics board shall provide the board of county commissioners with a quarterly report stating the number of complaints that were submitted alleging a violation of the ethics ordinance, the number of complaints submitted to the ethics board by the contract compliance officer and a summary of the status of each complaint to include the date of the complaint for the case to be heard and date for final possible action. The quarterly status report must be approved by the ethics board and made available to the public on the county's website...

I. ORGANIZATION

Ethics Board members during the reporting period were Robert Wilkins (District 1), Keith Brown (District 2), Cindy Adelsberg (District 3), Jordan Juarez (District 4), and Ramon Montano (District 5).

Ethics Board alternate member(s) during the reporting period was David Craig (District 1).

Contract Compliance Officer Luis Robles advises the Ethics Board and performs other duties as set forth in the Sandoval County Ethics Ordinance.

**II. ACTIVITIES RELATED TO THE DUTIES, RESPONSIBILITIES AND AUTHORITY
OF THE ETHICS BOARD DURING THE CURRENT REPORTING PERIOD**

The Ethics Board met once during the quarterly reporting period. By ordinance, the Ethics Board shall meet at least once per quarter, and more often when necessary, to hear cases, act on reports, issue advisory opinions, discuss policy, and/or approve quarterly reports.

COMPLAINTS

Number of complaints submitted alleging violation of the Ethics Ordinance: 0

Number of complaints submitted to Ethics Board by Contract Compliance Officer: 1

Summary of the status of each complaint:

- 1) Ethics Board Complaint No. 2024-002, Dehoff v. Eshleman and Gallegos, was submitted to the Contract Compliance Officer on or about March 24, 2024. Thereafter, the complaint was submitted to the Ethics Board. A Preliminary Hearing was conducted on June 10, 2024. At the conclusion of the Preliminary Hearing, the Ethics Board dismissed the complaint with prejudice. The Ethics Board acted upon this matter within ninety (90) days of submission as required by Sandoval County Ethics Ordinance Section 8(h)(2).

III. LOOKING FORWARD

The Ethics Board expects to fulfill its mandated duties and responsibilities, including its obligation to meet at least once per quarter, and more often when necessary.
